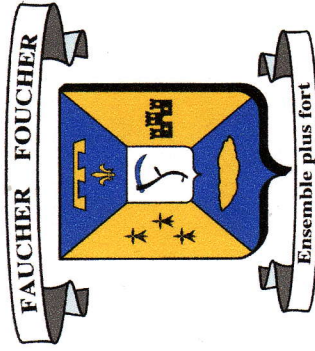

Creation of Association

On October 23rd 1999, a meeting was held in Ste-Foy, Quebec to create the Association des familles Faucher et Foucher. A temporary Board of Directors composed of 9 members was established to create the Association. The Association des Faucher et Foucher was incorporated on January 25th 2000, under the 3rd part of the Law regarding the non-profit companies in the Province of Quebec, Canada.

The Association is a member of the Fédération des familles-souches québécoise Inc. (Federation regrouping Quebec family founders). The Association is built only on a voluntary basis of its members and its Board of Directors.

Goals

The main purpose of the Association des Faucher et Foucher is to bring together all the descendants of Jean Foucher and Jeanne Malteau de Richecourt, who have taken the family name Foucher, Faucher and their descendants from the Leonard Faucher said 'Saint-Maurice' and Marie Damois, who have taken the name of Faucher, Châteauvert and Saint-Maurice.

Everyone has a natural curiosity and interest, not only to know more of their ancestors, but also to expand their circle of immediate family while fraternizing and creating friendship with their homonyms.

To answer those needs, the Association will help them to appreciate their origins, their history, their patrimony and the actual involvement of their descendants in their milieu, and possibly strengthen their family link and honour the memory of the elders by giving a part of their history and genealogy of their families.

ANCESTERS

Seven Frenchmen with the name of Foucher and at least one Faucher came to New-France in the 17th and 18th centuries. The researches, done so far, permit to confirm that two of them have some descendants using their family names.

Île d'Orleans Roots

Jean Foucher, carpenter, and his spouse Jeanne Malteau de Richecourt are at the origin of the Foucher lineage which for many became Faucher. Married in Québec City, on November 4th 1659, they established themselves at Ste-Famille on the Île d'Orleans (Quebec) and had three sons. Jean Foucher, son of Pierre and Jeanne Troplonge, was originally from Cressac, township of Blanzac near Angoulême in Charentes, France. He had arrived in New-France in 1657 or a bit before, since he leased, on March 20th 1658, for three years, land at the Île d'Orleans. His wife Jeanne Malteau de Richecourt, daughter of Paul de Richecourt and Marie Gaubert, came from Saint-Jean de La Cassine in Picardie in the Ardennes, France. Their descendants are known under the name of Foucher and Faucher.

The Neuville Roots

Leonard Faucher said « Saint Maurice », came in New-France, in 1666, employed as apprentice carpenter by Antoine Rouillard in Québec City. Son of Barthelemi Faucher and of Sibille Brians of Saint-Maurice in Limoges (where the nickname Saint-Maurice comes from) in Limousin, he married on October 15th 1669 in Québec City, a « fille du roi », Marie Damois, daughter of Pierre and Marie Lefebvre, originally from Elboeuf near Rouen in Normandy, France. Established at Neuville, Quebec, they had four sons and seven daughters; their descendants are Faucher or using the nickname Châteauvert and Saint-Maurice.
